Add at the end of subtitle A of title VIII the following:

6 (a) PROHIBITION ON USE OF FEDERAL FUNDS FOR FOREIGN PROCUREMENT.—No funds authorized in this 7 Act may be used to procure by contract, subcontract, 8 9 grant, cooperative agreement, or otherwise any product sourced, manufactured, or assembled in whole or in part 10 11 by a covered foreign entity that poses a supply chain risk to the national security of the United States, including 12 13 products identified in the report required under subsection 14 (b).

15 (b) REPORT.—

16 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 60 days after
17 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary
18 of Defense shall submit to the appropriate congres-

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1	sional committees a report concerning supply chain		
2	risks and vulnerabilities posed by a covered foreign		
3	entity to the national security of the United States,		
4	and methods to mitigate such risks and		
5	vulnerabilities.		
6	(2) MATTERS INCLUDED.—The report required		
7	under paragraph (1) shall include information relat-		
8	ing to such business sectors:		
9	(A) Rare earth material.		
10	(B) Cybersecurity.		
11	(C) Information security.		
12	(D) Defense industries.		
13	(E) Communication technology, including		
14	fifth generation technology.		
15	(c) WAIVER.—The President may waive the prohibi-		
16	tions under this section with respect to a product if the		
17	President determines and reports to the appropriate con-		
18	gressional committees that such waiver is in the national		
19	security interests of the United States.		
20	(d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:		
21	(1) Appropriate congressional commit-		
22	TEES.—The term "appropriate congressional com-		
23	mittees" means—		
24	(A) the Committee on Foreign Affairs, the		
25	Committee on Energy and Commerce, the Com-		

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mittee on Homeland Security, the Committee
 on Armed Services, the Committee on Veterans'
 Affairs, and the Committee on Ways and Means
 of the House of Representatives; and

5 (B) the Committee on Foreign Relations,
6 the Committee on Health, Education, Labor,
7 and Pensions, the Committee on Homeland Se8 curity and Governmental Affairs, the Com9 mittee on Armed Services, and the Committee
10 on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate.

(2) COVERED FOREIGN ENTITY.—The term
"covered foreign entity" means any entity domiciled
in China or subject to influence or control by China
or the Communist Party of China, as determined by
the Secretary of State.

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
