

AMENDMENT TO RULES COMM. PRINT 118-36
OFFERED BY MR. WALBERG OF MICHIGAN

At the end of subtitle F of title X, add the following
new section:

1 **SEC. 10 ____ . STUDY ON TESTING OF FOREIGN ADVERSARY**
2 **HIGHLY AUTONOMOUS VEHICLES.**

3 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Not later than 180 days after the
4 date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Defense,
5 in coordination with the relevant Federal agencies, shall
6 conduct a study on the effects on the national security
7 of the United States of highly automated vehicles (as such
8 term is defined in section 503(c)(6) of title 23, United
9 States Code) associated with foreign adversary countries
10 operating or testing in the United States.

11 (b) **MATTERS TO BE INCLUDED.**—The study re-
12 quired by subsection (a) shall also include the following:

13 (1) An evaluation of the technology used by
14 highly automated vehicles and their capabilities.

15 (2) A list of entities—

16 (A) domiciled in or directly or indirectly
17 owned, controlled, or directed by a foreign ad-
18 versary country;

1 (B) that manufacture highly automated ve-
2 hicles; and

3 (C) are currently operating highly auto-
4 mated vehicles in the United States.

5 (3) The number of highly automated vehicles
6 currently operating in the United States that are
7 owned or operated by such entities.

8 (4) An evaluation whether any such entity has
9 contracted with or supplied any technology to the
10 military of a foreign adversary country.

11 (5) The locations where highly automated vehi-
12 cles owned or operated by such entities are operating
13 in the United States.

14 (6) Potential vulnerabilities posed by the oper-
15 ation of such highly automated vehicles in the
16 United States.

17 (c) SUBMISSION.—The Secretary of Defense shall
18 submit the results of the study conducted pursuant to sub-
19 section (a) to—

20 (1) the Committee on Armed Services, the
21 Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental
22 Affairs, and the Committee on Commerce, Science,
23 and Transportation of the Senate; and

24 (2) the Committee on Armed Services, the
25 Committee on Homeland Security, and the Com-

1 mittee on Energy and Commerce of the House of
2 Representatives.
