

**AMENDMENT TO THE RULES COMMITTEE PRINT
FOR H.R. 1735
OFFERED BY MRS. WALORSKI OF INDIANA**

At the end of subtitle D of title XII, add the following (and conform the table of contents accordingly):

**1 SEC. 1234. SECURITY GUARANTEES ASSOCIATED WITH
2 IRAN'S NUCLEAR WEAPONS PROGRAM.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the
4 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of De-
5 fense, in coordination with the Secretary of State, shall
6 provide the appropriate congressional committees a copy
7 of any security agreement or commitment provided by the
8 United States to any country in the middle east, including
9 the member country of the Gulf Cooperation Council.

10 (b) ANALYSIS.—Not later than 30 days after the date
11 of the enactment of this Act, the Chairman of the Joint
12 Chiefs of staff shall provide the Secretary of Defense with
13 a detailed analysis of any United States military force
14 structure, and estimated costs associated with such force
15 structure. The Secretary shall provide such analysis, with-
16 out change, along with any additional views the Secretary
17 may offer, when the Secretary submits the materials re-
18 quired under subsection (a).

1 (c) LIMITATION ON CERTAIN EXPENDITURES.—The
2 Secretary of Defense may not obligate or expend any
3 funds authorized to be appropriated by this Act or other-
4 wise made available to the Department of Defense for fis-
5 cal year 2016 (including for the subsequent ten fiscal
6 years) for any activities related to operational or war plan-
7 ning related to an agreement described in subsection (a)
8 unless the Secretary first certifies to the appropriate con-
9 gressional committees that the Secretary has provided a
10 copy of such agreement as required under subsection (a).

11 (d) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES
12 DEFINED.—In this section, the term “appropriate con-
13 gressional committees” means the Committee on Armed
14 Services and the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the
15 House of Representatives and the Committee on Armed
16 Services and the Committee on Foreign Relations of the
17 Senate.
