2 (a) RESPONSIBILITY.—Chapter 97 of title 28, United
3 States Code, is amended by inserting after section 1605B

5 "§1605C. Responsibility of Foreign States for Death or Injury from International Fentanyl 7 Trafficking in the United States.

8 "(a) Responsibility of Foreign States.—A for-9 eign state shall not be immune from the jurisdiction of the courts of the United States in any case in which money 10 11 damages are sought against a foreign state for death or 12 physical injury to a person caused by fentanyl use or expo-13 sure that occurs in the United States following any reckless action of a covered person, that caused or substan-14 15 tially contributed to the unlawful trafficking of fentanyl from the foreign state into and within the United States. 16 17 "(b) COVERED PERSON DEFINED.—In this section, the term 'covered person' means— 18

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"(1) an alien who is unlawfully present in the
 United States;

3 "(2) a foreign opioid trafficker, as identified in
4 the report submitted under section 7211(a) of the
5 Fentanyl Sanctions Act; or

6 "(3) a significant foreign narcotics trafficker,
7 as identified in the report submitted under sub8 section (b) or (h)(1) of section 804 of the Foreign
9 Narcotics Kingpin Designation Act.

"(c) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—A foreign state shall
not be subject to the jurisdiction of the courts of the
United States under subsection (a) on the basis of an
omission or act that constitutes mere negligence.

14 "(d) EXCLUSIVE JURISDICTION.—The courts of the
15 United States shall have exclusive jurisdiction in any ac16 tion in which a foreign state is subject to the jurisdiction
17 of a court of the United States under subsection (a).

"(e) INTERVENTION.—The Attorney General may intervene in any action in which a foreign state is subject
to the jurisdiction of a court of the United States under
subsection (a) for the purpose of seeking a stay of the
civil action, in whole or in part.
