At the end of title VIII of the bill, add the following:

1 SEC. _____. STUDY AND REPORT ON CHILD SAFETY IN AVIA 2 TION.

3 (a) STUDY.—The Administrator of the Federal Avia-4 tion Administration, in consultation with the Secretary of 5 Health and Human Services, the Commissioner of Food 6 and Drugs, and the Consumer Product Safety Commis-7 sion, and the Administrator of the Transportation Security Administration, shall conduct a comprehensive study 8 9 on child safety in aviation. The study shall include an eval-10 uation of the following issues:

(1) The usage and aircraft compatibility of ageappropriate child safety seats and restraints, including the different passenger safety and restraint
needs of infants, toddlers, and older children with
aircraft passenger seating.

16 (2) Protection of strollers, child seats, and
17 other child safety equipment while in an aircraft
18 cargo hold.

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1	(3) Taking into account other evaluations of
2	airports for compliance with the requirements of the
3	Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C.
4	12101 et seq.), and section 504 of the Rehabilitation
5	Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794), evaluation of the ex-
6	tent to which diaper changing stations and areas
7	designated for breastfeeding are accessible in airport
8	terminals.
9	(4) The extent to which airport terminal design
10	requirements include measures relating to ensuring
11	the general physical safety of children in the ter-
12	minal and while on airport property.
13	(5) The extent to which airport and airline poli-
14	cies protect children from contagious diseases or in-
15	flight respiratory issues.
16	(6) The extent to which the revised training re-
17	quired by section 1950 of the FAA Reauthorization
18	Act of 2018 (49 U.S.C. 44901 note) for Transpor-
19	tation Security Officers related to the screening of
20	passengers with disabilities, including passengers
21	with disabilities who participate in the PreCheck
22	program, and the best practices recommended under
23	subsection (b) of such section, address the proper
24	screening, and any particular sensitivities related to

the screening, of passengers who are children with a
 disability.

3 (b) REPORT.—Not later than 180 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator shall submit to 4 the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure of 5 the House of Representatives and the Committee on Com-6 7 merce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate a report containing the results of the study conducted under sub-8 section (a), together with recommendations for such legis-9 lation as the Administrator determines appropriate. 10

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
