

AMENDMENT TO H.R. 1735, AS REPORTED
OFFERED BY MR. YOUNG OF ALASKA

At the end of subtitle B of title XXVIII, add the following new section:

1 **SEC. 28 ____ . REPORT ON EFFORTS TO REDUCE HIGH EN-**
2 **ERGY COSTS AT MILITARY INSTALLATIONS.**

3 (a) REPORT REQUIRED.—Not later than 270 days
4 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Under
5 Secretary of Defense for Acquisition, Technology, and Lo-
6 gistics, in conjunction with the Assistant Secretaries re-
7 sponsible for installations and environment for the mili-
8 tary departments and the Defense Logistics Agency, shall
9 submit to the congressional defense committees a report
10 detailing the efforts being made by the Department of De-
11 fense and the Armed Forces to achieve cost savings at
12 military installations with high energy costs.

13 (b) ELEMENTS OF REPORT.—The report required by
14 subsection (a) shall include the following elements:

15 (1) A comprehensive, installation-specific as-
16 sessment of feasible and mission-appropriate energy
17 initiatives supporting energy production and con-
18 sumption at military installations with high energy
19 costs.

1 (2) An assessment of current sources of energy
2 in areas with high energy costs and potential future
3 sources that are technologically feasible, cost-effec-
4 tive, and mission-appropriate for military installa-
5 tions.

6 (3) A comprehensive implementation strategy to
7 include required investment for feasible energy effi-
8 ciency options determined to be the most beneficial
9 and cost-effective, where appropriate, and consistent
10 with Department of Defense priorities.

11 (4) An explanation on how the military depart-
12 ments are working collaboratively in order to lever-
13 age lessons learned on potential energy efficiency so-
14 lutions.

15 (5) An assessment of extent to which activities
16 administered under the Federal Energy Management
17 Program could be used to assist with the implemen-
18 tation strategy described in paragraph (3).

19 (6) An assessment of State and local partner-
20 ship opportunities that could achieve efficiency and
21 cost savings, and any legislative authorities required
22 to carry out such partnerships or agreements.

23 (c) COORDINATION WITH STATE AND LOCAL AND
24 OTHER ENTITIES.—In preparing the report required by
25 subsection (a), the Under Secretary of Defense for Acqui-

1 sition, Technology, and Logistics may work in conjunction
2 and coordinate with the States containing areas of high
3 energy costs, local communities, and other Federal depart-
4 ments and agencies.

5 (d) HIGH ENERGY COSTS DEFINED.—In this section,
6 the term “high energy costs” means costs for the provision
7 of energy by kilowatt of electricity or British Thermal
8 Unit of heat or steam for a military installation in the
9 United States that is in the highest 20 percent of all mili-
10 tary installations for a military department.
