2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Part B of subtitle IV of title 46,

3 United States Code, is amended by adding at the end the

# 7 **"§ 42501. Definitions**

8 "In this chapter:

9 "(1) COMMISSION.—The term 'Commission'

- 10 means the Federal Maritime Commission.
- 11 "(2) COMMITTEE.—The term 'Committee'
- 12 means the National Shipper Advisory Committee es-
- 13 tablished by section 42502.

# 1 "§ 42502. National Shipper Advisory Committee

2 "(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established a Na3 tional Shipper Advisory Committee.

4 "(b) FUNCTION.—The Committee shall advise the
5 Federal Maritime Commission on policies relating to the
6 competitiveness, reliability, integrity, and fairness of the
7 international ocean freight delivery system.

8 "(c) Membership.—

9 "(1) IN GENERAL.—The Committee shall con10 sist of 24 members appointed by the Commission in
11 accordance with this section.

12 "(2) EXPERTISE.—Each member of the Com13 mittee shall have particular expertise, knowledge,
14 and experience in matters relating to the function of
15 the Committee.

16 "(3) REPRESENTATION.—Members of the Com17 mittee shall be appointed as follows:

18 "(A) Twelve members shall represent enti19 ties who import cargo to the United States
20 using ocean common carriers.

21 "(B) Twelve members shall represent enti22 ties who export cargo from the United States
23 using ocean common carriers.

# 1 "§ 42503. Administration

2 "(a) MEETINGS.—The Committee shall, not less than
3 once each year, meet at the call of the Commission or a
4 majority of the members of the Committee.

5 "(b) EMPLOYEE STATUS.—A member of the Com6 mittee shall not be considered an employee of the Federal
7 Government by reason of service on such Committee, ex8 cept for the purposes of the following:

9 "(1) Chapter 81 of title 5.

10 "(2) Chapter 171 of title 28 and any other
11 Federal law relating to tort liability.

12 "(c) ACCEPTANCE OF VOLUNTEER SERVICES.—Not13 withstanding any other provision of law, a member of the
14 Committee may serve on such committee on a voluntary
15 basis without pay.

16 "(d) Status of Members.—

17 "(1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in para18 graph (2), with respect to a member of the Com19 mittee whom the Commission appoints to represent
20 an entity or group—

21 "(A) the member is authorized to rep22 resent the interests of the applicable entity or
23 group; and

24 "(B) requirements under Federal law that
25 would interfere with such representation and
26 that apply to a special Government employee
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(as defined in section 202(a) of title 18), in cluding requirements relating to employee con duct, political activities, ethics, conflicts of in terest, and corruption, do not apply to the
 member.

6 "(2) EXCEPTION.—Notwithstanding subsection 7 (b), a member of the Committee shall be treated as 8 a special Government employee for purposes of the 9 committee service of the member if the member, 10 without regard to service on the Committee, is a spe-11 cial Government employee.

12 "(e) SERVICE ON COMMITTEE.—

"(1) SOLICITATION OF NOMINATIONS.—Before
appointing an individual as a member of the Committee, the Commission shall publish a timely notice
in the Federal Register soliciting nominations for
membership on such Committee.

18 "(2) Appointments.—

19 "(A) IN GENERAL.—After considering
20 nominations received pursuant to a notice pub21 lished under paragraph (1), the Commission
22 may appoint a member to the Committee.

23 "(B) PROHIBITION.—The Commission
24 shall not seek, consider, or otherwise use infor25 mation concerning the political affiliation of a

1	nominee in making an appointment to the Com-
2	mittee.
3	"(3) Service at pleasure of the commis-
4	SION.—Each member of the Committee shall serve
5	at the pleasure of the Commission.
6	"(4) Security background examinations.—
7	The Commission may require an individual to have
8	passed an appropriate security background examina-
9	tion before appointment to the Committee.
10	"(5) Prohibition.—A Federal employee may
11	not be appointed as a member of the Committee.
12	"(6) TERMS.—
13	"(A) IN GENERAL.—The term of each
14	member of the Committee shall expire on De-
15	cember 31 of the third full year after the effec-
16	tive date of the appointment.
17	"(B) Continued service after term.—
18	When the term of a member of the Committee
19	ends, the member, for a period not to exceed 1
20	year, may continue to serve as a member until
21	a successor is appointed.
22	"(7) VACANCIES.—A vacancy on the Committee
23	shall be filled in the same manner as the original ap-
24	pointment.

1 "(8) Special rule for reappointments.— 2 Notwithstanding paragraphs (1) and (2), the Com-3 mission may reappoint a member of a committee for 4 any term, other than the first term of the member, 5 without soliciting, receiving, or considering nomina-6 tions for such appointment. 7 "(f) STAFF SERVICES.—The Commission shall fur-8 nish to the Committee any staff and services considered 9 by the Commission to be necessary for the conduct of the Committee's functions. 10

11 "(g) CHAIR; VICE CHAIR.—

12 "(1) IN GENERAL.—The Committee shall elect
13 a Chair and Vice Chair from among the committee's
14 members.

15 "(2) VICE CHAIRMAN ACTING AS CHAIRMAN.—
16 The Vice Chair shall act as Chair in the absence or
17 incapacity of, or in the event of a vacancy in the of18 fice of, the Chair.

19 "(h) Subcommittees and Working Groups.—

"(1) IN GENERAL.—The Chair of the Committee may establish and disestablish subcommittees
and working groups for any purpose consistent with
the function of the Committee.

24 "(2) PARTICIPANTS.—Subject to conditions im25 posed by the Chair, members of the Committee may

be assigned to subcommittees and working groups
 established under paragraph (1).

3 "(i) CONSULTATION, ADVICE, REPORTS, AND REC4 OMMENDATIONS.—

5 "(1) CONSULTATION.—Before taking any sig-6 nificant action, the Commission shall consult with, 7 and consider the information, advice, and rec-8 ommendations of, the Committee if the function of 9 the Committee is to advise the Commission on mat-10 ters related to the significant action.

"(2) ADVICE, REPORTS, AND RECOMMENDATIONS.—The Committee shall submit, in writing, to
the Commission its advice, reports, and recommendations, in a form and at a frequency determined appropriate by the Committee.

16 "(3) EXPLANATION OF ACTIONS TAKEN.—Not
17 later than 60 days after the date on which the Com18 mission receives recommendations from the Com19 mittee under paragraph (2), the Commission shall—
20 "(A) publish the recommendations on a
21 public website; and

"(B) respond, in writing, to the Committee
regarding the recommendations, including by
providing an explanation of actions taken regarding the recommendations.

"(4) SUBMISSION TO CONGRESS.—The Commission shall submit to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Commerce, Science,
and Transportation of the Senate the advice, reports, and recommendations received from the Committee under paragraph (2).

8 "(j) OBSERVERS.—The Commission may designate a
9 representative to—

"(1) attend any meeting of the Committee; and
"(2) participate as an observer at such meeting.
"(k) TERMINATION.—The Committee shall terminate
on September 30, 2029.".

(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The analysis for subtitle IV of title 46, United States Code, is amended by
inserting after the item related to chapter 423 the following:

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
