Congress adopts the provisions of this title— 7 8 (1) as an exercise of the rulemaking power of 9 the Senate and the House of Representatives, re-10 spectively, and as such they shall be considered as 11 part of the rules of each House or of that House to 12 which they specifically apply, and such rules shall 13 supersede other rules only to the extent that they 14 are inconsistent with such other rules; and 15 (2) with full recognition of the constitutional 16 right of either the Senate or the House of Rep-17 resentatives to change those rules (insofar as they 18 relate to that House) at any time, in the same man-19 ner, and to the same extent as is the case of any 20 other rule of the Senate or House of Representa-21 tives.
