

**AMENDMENT TO RULES COMMITTEE PRINT 118-**

**24**

**OFFERED BY MR. ZINKE OF MONTANA**

Add at the end of the bill the following:

1 **SEC. 3. PROHIBITION ON ISSUING CERTAIN VISAS TO NA-**  
2 **TIONALS OF PALESTINE.**

3 (a) TEMPORARY PROTECTED STATUS.—The Sec-  
4 retary of Homeland Security may not grant a covered  
5 alien temporary protected status in the United States pur-  
6 suant to section 244 of the Immigration and Nationality  
7 Act (8 U.S.C. 1254a).

8 (b) IMMIGRANT AND NONIMMIGRANT VISAS.—

9 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Homeland  
10 Security and the Secretary of State may not approve  
11 any application for or issue a nonimmigrant or im-  
12 migrant visa, as applicable, to a covered alien.

13 (2) REVOCATION.—The Secretary of Homeland  
14 Security shall revoke any nonimmigrant or immi-  
15 grant visa issued to a covered alien on or after Octo-  
16 ber 1, 2023.

17 (c) ASYLUM.—

18 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Homeland  
19 Security or the Attorney General may not grant asy-

1 lum to a covered alien who has applied for asylum  
2 in accordance with section 208 of the Immigration  
3 and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1158).

4 (2) REVOCATION.—The Secretary of Homeland  
5 Security shall revoke a covered alien’s status as an  
6 asylee if such status was applied for on or after Oc-  
7 tober 1, 2023.

8 (d) REFUGEE STATUS.—

9 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Homeland  
10 Security may not grant admission as a refugee to a  
11 covered alien.

12 (2) REVOCATION.—The Secretary of Homeland  
13 Security shall revoke a covered alien’s status as a  
14 refugee if such status was applied for on or after  
15 October 1, 2023.

16 (e) PAROLE.—

17 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Homeland  
18 Security may not parole into the United States a  
19 covered alien.

20 (2) REVOCATION.—The Secretary of Homeland  
21 Security shall revoke a covered alien’s parole if such  
22 alien was paroled into the United States on or after  
23 October 1, 2023.

24 (f) INADMISSIBILITY.—A covered alien shall be inad-  
25 missible to the United States.

1           (g) REMOVAL.—Beginning on the date of the enact-  
2 ment of this Act, the Secretary of Homeland Security, in  
3 coordination with the Director of U.S. Immigration and  
4 Customs Enforcement and the Director of U.S. Citizen-  
5 ship and Immigration Services, shall promptly identify  
6 covered aliens who do not have lawful status under the  
7 immigration laws (as such term is defined in section 101  
8 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1101))  
9 and take such steps as necessary to remove such aliens.

10          (h) COVERED ALIEN DEFINED.—In this section, the  
11 term “covered alien” means an alien who is a holder of  
12 a passport or other travel document issued by the Pales-  
13 tinian Authority.
