OFFERED BY MR. SCHWEIKERT OF ARIZONA

At the end of subtitle A, of title IV, add the following:

1 **SEC. 4114. ANNUAL SURVEY OF EXPENDITURES BY SNAP**

2 **HOUSEHOLDS TO PURCHASE FOOD.**

3 (a) SURVEY INFORMATION CONTENT.—The Sec-
4 retary of Agriculture shall conduct and publish an annual
5 survey, containing data including categorized by—

6 (1) distribution of expenditures by the supple-
7 mental nutrition assistance program households to
8 purchase foods—

9 (A) in major food groups;

10 (B) at retail store type (e.g., convenience
11 stores, gas stations, large retailers, small gro-
12 cers);

13 (C) for food with more than 100 calories;

14 and

15 (D) for foods with less than 10 grams of
16 protein;

1 (2) distribution of the amount of allotments
2 spent by such households for unhealthy food (as de-
3 fined by the Secretary); and

4 (3) consumption patterns of such households of
5 particularized by type of food purchased allotments.

6 (b) MAJOR FOOD GROUP.—For purposes of this sub-
7 section, the term “major food group” means the categories
8 of foods identified by the Department of Agriculture as
9 part of the My Plate dietary guidance, including—

- 10 (1) fruits;
11 (2) vegetables;
12 (3) grains;
13 (4) protein foods; or
14 (5) dairy products.

15 Such term may include oils as part of a healthy dietary
16 pattern, consistent with Federal dietary guidance.

17 (c) ANNUAL REPORT.—The Secretary shall submit to
18 the Congress an annual report that contains a summary
19 during the then most recently ended survey conducted, de-
20 scribing—

- 21 (1) the diet quality and health outcomes (in-
22 cluding BMI reduction, A1C levels, blood sugar, glu-
23 cose) of supplemental nutrition assistance program
24 households;

1 (2) changes in food purchasing patterns base on
2 how much such households spend on food and which
3 foods they purchase;

4 (3) the effectiveness of any nutrition-related re-
5 strictions and incentives implemented under this
6 subsection; and

7 (4) any impacts observed in the incidence of
8 fraud in, and on the integrity of, the supplemental
9 nutrition assistance program.
